Festival of Cultures



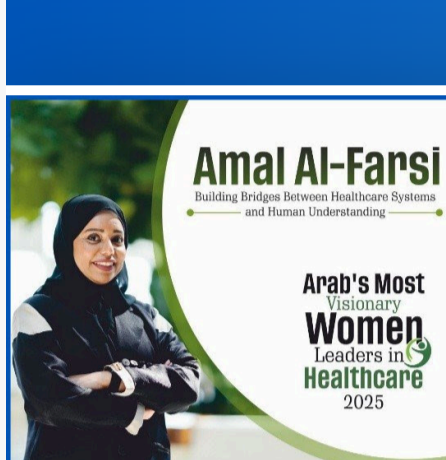

Career Success Essentials



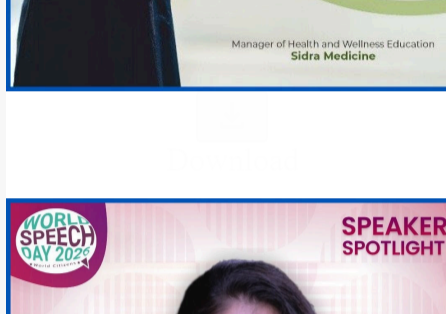

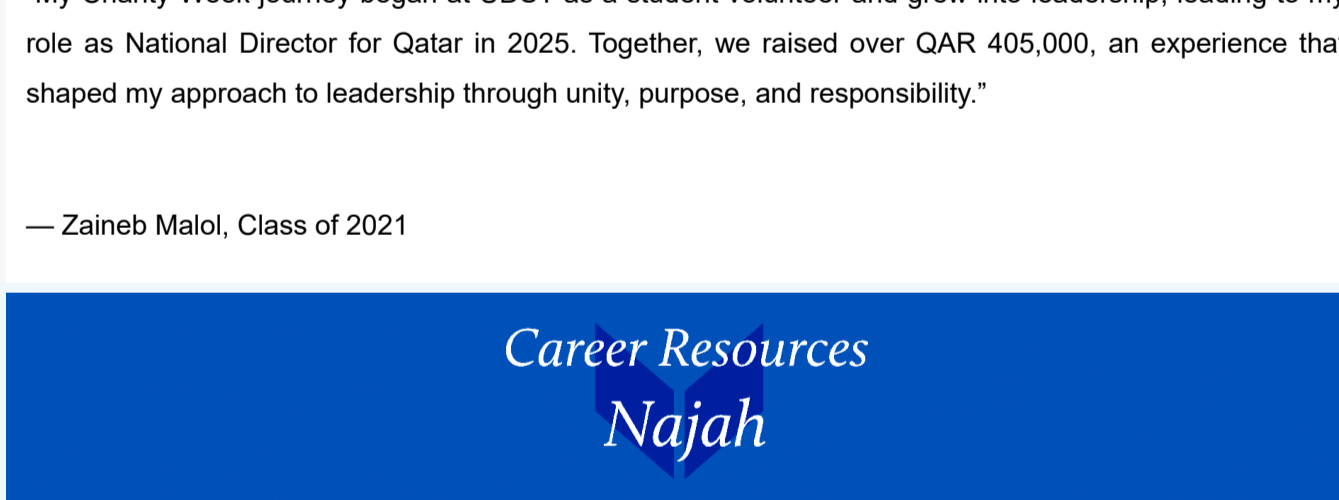


Zaineb Malol

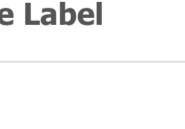
